You do not need to solve everything today. The goal is simply to slow down, ask thoughtful questions, and begin creating clarity together.

## 1. Beginning the Conversation

- What has recently caused us to start thinking about this?
- Are we planning ahead proactively, or reacting to increasing stress?
- What feels most overwhelming right now?
- What would an ideal next chapter look like?
- What fears or hesitations do we each have?

## 2. Lifestyle & Daily Living

- Would less home maintenance improve daily life?
- How important are social activities and community?
- Would we enjoy amenities like pickleball, clubs, walking trails, or fitness classes?
- Do we want more freedom to travel without worrying about the home?
- Would simplifying life reduce stress?

## 3. Health & Future Planning

- Are there any early health or mobility concerns we should plan ahead for?
- Would future care options nearby create peace of mind?
- Does one spouse currently need more support than the other?

- Are we trying to avoid making decisions during a future crisis?
- What kind of support system would feel reassuring?

## **4. Emotional Questions**

- What memories make the current home difficult to leave?
- What would we miss most?
- What parts of life might become easier after simplifying?
- What would help this transition feel less like loss and more like a next chapter?
- How can family members support one another through this process?

## **5. The Home Transition**

- What repairs or updates may eventually be needed?
- What belongings would we want to keep, gift, donate, or simplify?
- Would starting small now reduce future stress?
- What timeline feels realistic?
- Would having a clear housing plan bring relief?

## **6. Questions to Ask Communities**

- What activities and clubs are available?
- Are there wellness, fitness, or pickleball opportunities?
- What dining and social spaces exist?
- How does the community support both active living and future care needs?
- Do residents genuinely seem connected and engaged?
